To compare two things, use the **comparative + than**: *Your trainers are cooler than my trainers.*
If two things are the same, use **as ... as**: *Your trainers are as cool as my trainers.*
If two things aren't the same, use **not as ... as**: *Your trainers aren't as cool as my trainers.*
